One of our greatest presidents and without question the greatest sportsman ever to occupy the White House, Roosevelt lived what he styled “the strenuous life” to the fullest. Along with devoting his energies to politics and sport, TR was a prolific writer. Here’s a sampling of books by and about him. 1. *African Game Trails*. NY: Charles Scribner’s, 1910. xvi, 529 pages. Illus., appendices, maps, index. Front fly leaf present. Hardback (good--cover worn, internally tight and clean). Early copy. \$60.
2. Another copy of the same edition. This one ex lib. with chip to top of spine. Internally very good plus. \$40.
3. Another copy. This one 1<sup>st</sup> edition but badly worn and shaken. Reading copy. \$10.
4. Another copy. NY and London: Syndicate Publishing, 1910. Hardback (very good with gilt front attractive). [xxiv], 583 pages. Illus. \$40.
5. Another copy. This one the two-volume edition (NY: Scribner’s, 1922) which was a part of TR’s complete works. Good to very good (internally fine). \$45. Two sets available.
6. Another copy. Volume 2 only of the 1924 Scribner’s reprinting. Very good. Only \$5, and a great acquisition if you can acquire Volume 1.
